UNC CHARLOTTE FACULTY BRASS QUINTET

DR. ERIC MILLARD, TRUMPET Eric Millard is the Assistant Professor of Trumpet at UNC Charlotte. Millard regularly performs with the Charlotte Symphony and was formerly the Third/Associate Principal trumpet with the Tallahassee Symphony. Millard has also performed with the Charlotte Ballet, Opera Carolina, Boise Philharmonic, Ballet Idaho, Pensacola Symphony, Sinfonia Gulf Coast, Northwest Florida Symphony, and Albany Symphony. Millard's fond interest in chamber music has led him to cofound both the Bluegrass Brass and Garnet and Brass quintets and he currently performs with the UNC Charlotte Faculty Brass Quintet. In addition to brass quintets, Millard has won prizes at the National Trumpet Competition (NTC) and performed at the International Trumpet Guild Conference with multiple trumpet ensembles. Playing in a wide range of styles, Millard has also performed in numerous shows, including most recently, the national tour of Aladdin the Musical. Millard received his Doctorate and Master's Degrees in Trumpet Performance from Florida State University and received a Bachelor's Degree in Trumpet Performance from the University of Kentucky.

DR. SHAWN SMITH, TRUMPET Dr. Shawn Smith is Director of Bands and Associate Professor of Conducting at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte. In high demand as a band and orchestra conductor, clinician, and adjudicator, Smith has been invited to conduct professional and educational ensembles throughout the United States and conducts regularly in South America. An accomplished trumpeter, Smith has served as principal trumpet in the top ensembles at Louisiana State and Boise State. He has also performed with the Corpus Christi Symphony, the Boise Philharmonic Orchestra (Idaho), the Acadiana Symphony (Louisiana), Keith Brion's New Sousa Band, and with the Temptations. Dr. Smith holds a Doctor of Musical Arts degree in instrumental conducting from Arizona State University, and Master of Music and Bachelor of Music Education degrees from Louisiana State University and Boise State University, respectively. Prior to his appointment at UNC Charlotte, Smith spent eight years as Director of Bands at Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi.

DR. CHRISTOPHER GRIFFIN, HORN Christopher Griffin is a private horn instructor and a freelance musician in the Charlotte area. He is adjunct instructor of horn at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte and Wingate University where he also teaches sight singing and ear training. He is a member of the Western Piedmont and Union Symphony Orchestras. He has performed as an extra with the Charlotte Symphony, Greenville Symphony and the Charleston Symphony Orchestras. He currently maintains a private horn studio in Fort Mill, South Carolina, coaches chamber music at several local schools and has been on faculty at the Interlochen Center for the Arts Summer Music Festival. He is an active member of the International Horn Society in regular participation at regional and international seminars. Dr. Griffin received his DMA from the University of Southern California, MM degrees in music theory and horn performance from Temple University and the BM in horn performance from Auburn University. His primary teachers include Richard Todd, Randy Gardner and Dr. Randall Faust.

DR. JEREMY MARKS, TROMBONE Dr. Jeremy Marks started his position as Assistant Professor of Trombone at UNC Charlotte in the fall of 2018. Dr. Marks is the 2nd trombonist with Opera Carolina, North Carolina Brass Band, and bass trombonist of the Asheville Symphony Orchestra. In addition, he has performed with several symphony orchestras, including Charlotte, Virginia, Baton Rouge, Austin (TX), and Canton (OH), as well as the North Carolina Brass Band. His doubling credits on bass trombone, bass trumpet, and euphonium can be heard on the Naxos, Mark Customs, Arcadia, and Longhorn record labels. He is a member of the 2013 International Trombone Association Quartet Competition winner, Northside Trombone Quartet. Other performing credits include several regional, national, and international venues, such as the 2018 and 2019 International Trombone Festivals and the 2017 International Women's Brass Conference. Dr. Marks holds memberships with the International Trombone Association, International Tuba and Euphonium Association, and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia. He is an S.E. Shires Trombone Artist and exclusively performs on Greg Black mouthpieces. Dr. Marks earned his Doctor of Musical Arts degree from The University of Texas at Austin, Master of Music from Western Michigan University, and Bachelor of Music from Bowling Green State University.

DR. IAN MCCOLLUM, TUBA/EUPHONIUM Currently serving as Instructor of Tuba and Euphonium at UNC Charlotte, Dr. Ian McCollum enjoys balancing active performing and composing activity in conjunction with high school ensemble education in the greater Charlotte area, as well as active clinician work across the southeast. He has spent the last several years earning a reputation of versatility, sensitivity, and musical conviction in both his performances and compositions. A largely self-taught composer, he has written for brass, strings and percussion and endeavors to bridge the gap between performer and audience with each composition. As an avid performer, Dr. McCollum's experience in ensemble settings ranges from orchestral to jazz and swing bands on tuba, euphonium, and trombone. He is also a prize-winning soloist and has enjoyed competing nationally and internationally. Dr. McCollum holds a Doctorate of Brass Performance from Florida State University, a Masters of Music from Columbus State University, and a Bachelors of Music from the University of North Alabama.
