Kari Giles, violin is the assistant concertmaster for the Charlotte Symphony Orchestra, and began Suzuki violin studies at age five. Her love of music led to summers at Brevard Music Center with Mary Daniels, and High School and College degrees under Elaine Richey at the North Carolina School of the Arts. Following a desire for adventure and chamber music, she pursued a master's degree in Chamber Music at the San Francisco Conservatory. A meeting and performance with Minnesota Concertmaster Jorja Fleezanis lured her away from California to the frozen Midwest, where she spent several years studying with Mrs. Fleezanis, as well as performing with the Minnesota Opera, Minnesota Orchestra, and St. Paul Chamber Orchestra.

Jenny Topilow, violin is also a violinist with the Charlotte Symphony and was born into an artistic family and began violin lessons at the age of three. She studied under former Cleveland Orchestra member Stephen Majeske throughout high school and received her Bachelor of Music degree from the Cleveland Institute of Music in 2002. Afterward, Jenny earned her Master of Music degree from Carnegie Mellon University. While in Pennsylvania, she studied with Andres Cardenes, the concertmaster of the Pittsburg Symphony. After graduating in 2004, Jenny came to North Carolina and joined the Charlotte Symphony in September of that year.

Kirsten Swanson, viola The Classical Voice of North Carolina described violist Kirsten Swanson as a "stunning musician with flawless technique combined with that unique 'viola' sound that can melt your soul." Feeling equally at ease with "new" and "old" music in an orchestra or as a soloist, Dr. Swanson enjoys a diverse career that takes her all over the world. As an orchestral musician, Dr. Swanson held the position of Assistant Principal viola with the Charlotte Symphony from 2005-2007. She has won positions in the Winston-Salem Symphony and Greensboro Symphonies, and is frequently invited to sit guest principal viola with the Amarillo Symphony in Amarillo, Texas. Music has taken Kirsten across the United States, Europe, and South America as a guest violist in festivals in Holland, England, France, Italy, Austria, Spain, Peru, and Chile. Nationally, she participated in the Garth Newel Chamber Festival, Kneisel Hall, and, as a New Horizons Fellow, the Aspen Music Festival in Colorado. Dr. Swanson holds degrees from the Eastman School of Music, the Longy School, and the University of North Carolina in Greensboro. Currently, she is the adjunct viola professor at the University of North Carolina-Charlotte and an acting section violist with the North Carolina Symphony.

Mira Frisch, cello is Associate Professor of Cello and Director of String Chamber Music at UNC Charlotte. Dr. Frisch previously taught cello and chamber music at Truman State University in Missouri and at the summer festival Musicale della Toscana in Italy. She has performed as a recitalist and chamber musician throughout the United States and in Bermuda, Italy, and France. Her recordings as a member of Duo XXI, with violinist Anna Cromwell, were released on the Albany Records label in 2010 and 2014. Dr. Frisch can also be heard on the album "There Lies the Home", produced by Cantus; and the Albany recordings Songs of the Fisherman, and Dark Dances, a recording of the chamber music of John Allemeier. She has presented at national conferences of the American String Teachers Association, College Music Society, Music Teachers National Association. In the Carolinas, Dr. Frisch has performed as guest principal cellist with the Charleston Symphony, and as a section cellist with the Charlotte Symphony Orchestra. She is past-president of the North Carolina Chapter of the American String Teachers Association. Dr. Frisch received the Bachelor of Arts degree in Music and Mathematics from Saint Olaf College, the Master of Music degree in Cello Performance from the Cleveland Institute of Music, and the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Cello Performance from the University of Minnesota.
