## **CULTIVATING COMMUNITY**

Adult Winter Sunday School, 9:30am

Together we will explore Jesus's vision of what life together is meant to embody. The Sermon on the Mount calls us to cultivate our relationships in unity and hope.

"The Sermon on the Mount is the key to understanding who Jesus was and what it means to follow in his way. Yet we struggle to know how it pertains to our lives today. Formed by the prevailing individualism of Western culture, we try to read the Sermon as a set of personal instructions – and we fail. Often we accept that the way of life described here is the way that Jesus intends for us, but amidst our fragmented daily routine we lose hope of actually being able to live accordingly. When it comes to the harder teachings of Jesus – "Love your enemies," "Do not worry about tomorrow" – we may even rationalize why we don't have to have to take his words seriously.

Yet Jesus' teachings in the Sermon on the Mount were not meant primarily for us as individuals. Rather, they offer a vision of what maturity in Christ looks like for our church communities. As German theologian Gerhard Lohfink reminds us, God's redemptive work in the world consists in the gathering of a people. This work began with ancient Israel, the descendants of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, and was carried forward by Jesus, who gathered a little community of twelve disciples as a symbol of the twelve tribes of Israel. After Pentecost, when these disciples were sent out, Gentiles were invited to be part of God's people as well as Jews, and the people of God was no longer defined by ethnicity." ~ Christopher Smith






