Dear Members of Selwyn Avenue Presbyterian Church,

For many, this past year has led to a shift in priorities, vocations, living situations, and even relationships. What does it mean to be 'The Church' during this chaotic time? The Preacher of Hebrews said, "faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see." COVID-19 has challenged SAPC in every way possible. For all that has changed, for all we've lost, for all we love, and for all we hope; there is plenty we cannot see. Yet, as the gospel hymn suggests, Selwyn has 'Come this Far by Faith.'

Selwyn Avenue continues to be an intergenerational, inclusive community of Christian faith. With creativity, resiliency, and compassion we have endured. Thank you for your steadfast commitment to one another and to Christ. As a witness to countless acts of generosity, expressions of faithfulness, and sacrifices of time, I am both humbled and excited to journey with you, the Saints of Selwyn Avenue. Selwyn's Elders met during a two-day leadership retreat last June for group discernment and strategic planning. Collectively, we realized how much we have missed worshipping and living together with Christ as our unifying force. We agreed it was time to focus on what matters most, by re-prioritizing and ordering our lives according to God's love and grace. Therefore, the Session adopted an action plan to jumpstart every ministry within the church by focusing on four key initiatives:

- Welcoming members and visitors back to worship in ways that are safe, flexible, and engaging.
- Re-claiming joy in community, reminding folks what it means to belong and to be loved.
- Personally committing to weekly worship while relaunching all groups and programs by September 12th.
- Re-kindling relationships by intentionally reaching out, listening, and inviting folks into community.

The Session also adopted five guideposts for our leadership and decision making.

Selwyn is hospitable, intergenerational, authentic, mission-oriented, and supportive.



ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL AT 9:30AM

SAPC offers four classes, each distinct in their style and content. Our spaces are updated, and big enough for small groups to gather (with masks on), until we hear otherwise from the COVID task force.

- <u>Covenant Class</u> (Parlor)- Lecture based, traditional learning with discussion. This class is open to all, while a majority of the participants are over 65 years of age. Biblically based curriculum will be used.
- <u>Selwyn Life Class</u> (Library)- Discussion based, group learning. This class is a hybrid of in person and ZOOM learners. They are self-taught and coordinated, and are using the book, *Healing our Broken Humanity.*
- <u>Grace Class</u> (Outside or Fellowship Hall)- Bible study and practical application, focusing on the scriptures guiding our preaching series, Known By Heart: Scripture Every Christian Should Know. The class is open to all, and hosts a diversity of life stages and perspectives.
- <u>Peace Class</u> (Outside or Fellowship Hall)- A gathering space for young adults and other members to connect and reflect upon the big questions of faith through *Foundations and Fellowship*. Come for coffee, fellowship, and a spiritual centering.

YOUTH SUNDAY SCHOOL AT 9:30AM

- <u>Confirmation</u>- 8th graders meet each week with Youth Director, Margo Richardson in the Grace room.
- <u>Coffee Talks</u>- Real talk about life and faith. A topic will be launched, then youth break into age appropriate groups for mentored discussions with adult guides. The class meets in the Bates House.

ELEMENTARY CHILDREN'S SUNDAY SCHOOL AT 9:30AM

Elementary Children (K-5) gather with Children's Director, Nancy Nutter, for storytelling in the Bowman Building, then break into age appropriate classes for crafts and games led by a dedicated team of teachers.

PRESCHOOL AND NURSERY—SUNDAY SCHOOL AT 9:30AM AND WORSHIP AT10:30AM

Infants and preschoolers are greeted by our long-standing, loving nursery keepers. Preschoolers enjoy a Bible lesson and activities. As an expression of our baptismal vows, member volunteers can support the children by volunteering in the classrooms. Parents of children under the age of four are strongly encouraged to volunteer at least once a semester.

A note about the care and safety of our children: All volunteers and adults teaching and caring for our children will be required to wear masks at all times, as well as children over the age of three.

ELEMENTARY CHILDREN'S WORSHIP AT 10:30AM

All Elementary children are invited to worship in the sanctuary. After the Children's Message they are invited to join Nancy Nutter for Children's Chapel, engage in a story, and crafts before returning to the Sanctuary during the Doxology.

HUNGER

<u>First Sunday Food Drive</u> - Help stock the shelves by purchasing requested grocery items and return to church on the first Sunday of each month for Montclaire Elementary School. HOMELESSNESS

<u>Room in the Inn</u> - In partnership with Roof Above, beginning December 1 through March 31 each Monday night we will feed and host some of our homeless neighbors. We need many helpers - church bus drivers for pick up and return, three meals (dinner upon arrival, breakfast and bag lunches), set up and clean up crews, and overnight hosts. Help one time or every week!
