75TH ANNIVERSARY FUND

## The 75th Anniversary Fund has enabled these things to be accomplished since 2016:

- The Scout Hut, Bowman Building, Kitchen, Fellowship Hall & Chapel all received new roofs.
- The Bates House mortgage was paid in full.
- The 3019 Selwyn Avenue property (next to the Bates House) was purchased & the uninhabitable house was demolished.
- McClure Nicholson Montgomery Architects were engaged to design the renovation plans for the main property and we entered into a contract with Hopedale Builders to complete the three stages of renovations.
- A new sidewalk & drainage system was completed on the south side of the Child Development Center, to create better drainage and provide a safe, quick exit for CDC classrooms in case of emergency.
- Throughout the facility revitalization process, work was done behind walls and ceilings to upgrade plumbing, lighting and electrical, and mechanical needs which improved the permanent systems and structures.
- During Stage 1, work included a new ramp and handrail for handicap access to the sanctuary, bringing the hallway near the organ up to egress code as well as building a new side platform and stairs to meet current codes, the unisex bathroom in the hallway was renovated to comply with Americans with Disabilities Act Standards, and a new bathroom was created in the sanctuary narthex which provides the same; two storage areas were built in the Fellowship Hall, and the small upstairs bathroom received a facelift.
- Stage 2 of the renovation, required relocating the front offices to the upstairs Bowman building and closing off the parlor, chapel, library, and Old Session room. Outside footings were poured and beams were installed to build a portico entrance and steps to the new Welcome Center. Walls were demoed to open up the front entry area. At this time work was required in the downstairs Child Development Center kitchen and workroom to bolster areas for the upstairs renovation, French doors were installed on the Welcome Center, in the new library and workroom additional framing was done and walls were built, new bookcases were installed in the library, mini-split HVAC units were installed for the main floor spaces being renovated, a skylight was installed in the new library, folding doors were installed in the library to section spaces as needed for meetings, on the stairs going down to the Child Development Center, the ladies restroom beside the chapel was given a facelift, cabinetry was installed in the new workroom, a ramp was installed for Welcome Center entry.
- During Stage 3, the Spire door was closed off and later removed, an office was created in the former Spire entry, new lighting was installed in the Spire hallway, A/V technology was installed in the chapel, parlor and library, and painting was completed. Stage 3 will also include new handrails, masonry work, including a built-up planting bed and a small amphitheater structure outside. The outside work will continue but is also hampered by weather conditions.
- New flooring was installed in the Welcome Center, hallways leading from that space, the chapel, library, workroom and new office space. New carpet was installed in the parlor, up the stairs and in the upstairs office hallway.
- The chapel now has flexible seating. Additional furniture and decorating touches were added throughout the newly renovated areas.
- The staff was strengthened and stabilized with the calls and installations of Lori Raible as Co-Pastor and Mary Bowman as Associate Pastor for Mission, the employment of Jay Masanotti as full-time Youth Director and Jessica Masanotti as part-time Communications Specialist.
- The church installed a new database and our website [www.selwynpres.org](http://www.selwynpres.org) was reformatted and redesigned.
- Part of the Mission tithe enabled initial funding of the new Greater Enrichment Program for an afterschool program at Montclair Elementary.
- Additional monies are in the process of providing an upgrade to the hot water system for Room in the Inn/Bowman building.
- Exterior renovations and landscaping are scheduled for completion in the next few months as weather permits!
